

8. Course Objectives

Objectives of the course:

- . Preserving the sanctity of the Holy Qur'an, its status, and defending it in a sound academic and scientific manner
- 2. Connecting students to the scientific and civilizational heritage that Islam brought and the establishment of the Holy Qur'an, and benefiting from this in preserving it and continuing its continuity in the present and the future.
- 3. Encouraging scientific excellence and creativity in all fields of Quranic research, developing the love of knowledge, increasing the knowledge of Sharia sciences, and learning about modern curricula in learning, teaching and knowledge, and benefiting from them in the service of the sober scientific truth.

Cognitive Goals

- 1. Identify the concept of the history of the Qur'an and explain its topics and importance in Qur'anic studies
- 2. Knowing the stages that the revelation of the Holy Qur'an went through from its beginning to its completion.
- 3. Familiarity with the causes of revelation and its role in interpreting the Qur'anic text and understanding its implications.

- 8. Distinguish between Qur'anic terms such as: plural, codification, Qur'an, and readings

- 5. Mastering the skill of inference from Quranic texts, hadiths of the Prophet and the sayings of scholars on issues of the history of the Qur'an.
- 6. Learn the methods of documentation and investigation of ancient Quranic manuscripts and Ottoman Qurans
- 7. Developing the ability to link the history of the Qur'an with other sciences such as the science of interpretation, hadith, and jurisprudence.
- 8. Developing the skill of presentation and academic research in the topics of the history of the Qur'an through writing short reports or researches.
- 9. Using modern technical means (digital libraries, databases, manuscript images) in the study of the history of the Qur'an.
- 10. Accustoming the student to the scientific discussion and dialogue on controversial issues in the history of the Qur'an in an objective and sober manner.
